LIMITATIONS

The Guardian receives many more requests than it is able to support. Therefore, we have established funding limitations. The Guardian does not provide funding for:

- Individuals
- Research projects
- Endowments
- Travel
- Organizations without tax-exempt status under section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service Tax Code
- Social, labor, veterans, alumni or fraternal organizations serving a limited constituency
- Political causes, candidates or legislative lobbying efforts
- Advertising or marketing activities
- Capital campaigns
- Religious organizations such as churches and synagogues (except if their outreach programs are offered to the general population and they have established a separate 501(c)(3) organization to operate the programs)

CRITERIA FOR PROPOSAL REVIEW AND SELECTION

In evaluating requests for support, we look for established, high-quality programs and organizations that provide direct housing services to those in need or work to create or improve policies that affect the availability of affordable housing. Funding decisions are based on, but not limited to, the following factors:

- **Location of organization** – must be in a Guardian operating community (New York City; Bethlehem, Pennsylvania; Spokane, Washington; and Appleton, Wisconsin)
- **Organizational capacity**, including history of addressing affordable housing issues in the community – organizations to be supported must have been in existence and working in the affordable housing field for at least five years
- **Fit** between community needs and the services to be offered
- **Program outcomes**, including expected measurable impact/outcomes and system for measurement
- **Clear and feasible program budget**, including demonstrated ability to raise money from other sources

HOW TO APPLY FOR SUPPORT

Guardian limits its support to nonprofit organizations located in our four operating communities that work in the area of Affordable Housing.

Organizations interested in applying for a grant should submit two copies of the Guardian Life Insurance Company Affordable Housing Grant Application along with two copies of each of the following required attachments. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
